Nomination procedure	Partner institutions will receive an e-mail approximately one month prior to the nomination submission date, requesting that they enter their nominees' information onto an online system.
Nomination submission dates	Autumn Semester: Mar 1 Spring Semester: Oct 1

Application submission dates	Autumn Semester: Mar 15 Spring Semester: Oct 15
Length of exchange	Either one or two semesters
Number of exchange students	Determined by mutual agreement between both institutions, and contingent upon the number stipulated in the Student Exchange Memorandum (SEM)
Exchange participants (UG/PG)	Undergraduate and graduate students, including graduate research students.
GPA	Minimum 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent

Language requirements (Proficiency in either English OR Japanese)	Non-native English speakers wishing to participate in the English-language curriculum should possess one of the following scores: TOEFL iBT 79, IELTS 6.0, TOEIC 780, CEFR B2, or CET-6 485. (Students from Scandinavia, Germany, Austria, The Netherlands, Hong Kong and Singapore are exempt from this requirement, as are students who have an English language education background.) Students intending to take university courses instructed in Japanese must possess N1/level 1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT), or the equivalent.
Notification of acceptance (e-mail)	Vis-à-vis April admission: Mid-late January; Vis-à-vis September admission: Mid-June.
Transcript issuance	Soft copy sent both to home university and student approximately six weeks after the completion of the exchange.

Semester dates	Autumn Semester: Oct 2 – Feb 2 Spring Semester: Apr 9 – Aug 1 (tentative)
Credit load	Minimum 15 (30 ECTS) credits per semester, or 30 (60 ECTS) per academic year. No maximum ceiling is set.

Limitation regarding course selection?	1) NUPACE <i>Special Undergraduate</i> and <i>Special Graduate</i> Students majoring in Chemistry or Physics are generally <u>not</u> permitted to enrol in G30 courses with laboratory content. 2) Students wishing to apply for clerkships at the School of Medicine should follow application instructions on the NUPACE website carefully.
Provision of language training courses	Japanese and other foreign language classes are held during the semester for credit.

V. Accommodation

Type of accommodation offered	In principle, single rooms in student dormitories located either on-campus or within a short commute to the university.
University housing fees	25,000-40,000 JPY per month, including utilities.
Application method	NUPACE will apply for housing on the student's behalf.

VI. Expenses (in local currency)

Insurance	Health (1,700 JPY per month) and personal liability insurance (1,800 JPY per annum)
Food	Approximately 20,000-30,000 JPY per month
Public transport	Students living in <i>International Residence – Daiko</i> will pay 5,400 JPY per month in commuting expenses.
